Message from the Mayor:

As Independence Day approaches, let me explain a couple of items. First, because the 4th of July falls on a Sunday this year, we are unable to organize the recognition event that we have provided in the past. We encourage everyone to display the flag on their property in some fashion and to remember the purpose of the holiday. Secondly, fireworks sales are allowed at licensed outlets in the city during the two weeks prior to July 4th. Please only use legal fireworks in approved areas and, even then, participate with care. These restrictions and precautions are intended to help prevent fires or injuries. Plan to have, as they say, a “safe and sane” Independence Day.

I hope you are all planning to participate with us this year in the Chubbuck Days celebration. The traditional parade and festival are scheduled for Saturday, August 14th. For the third year, we are going to provide a youth dance at the Hockey Rink on Friday evening, and it will again double as a fund raising activity for the Highland High School Student Government.
